# CODE OF CONDUCT ON THE MOUNTAIN

The Mountain Code of Conduct establishes rules aimed at promoting responsible and courteous conduct among users of the trails. Before your first descent, it is important to be aware of certain rules:

### **1. USE THE LIFTS SAFELY!**

- On the Magic Carpet, remain standing (not walking) until you reach the top. Hold your tube vertically in front of you.
- In the chair lift, hold your tube in front of you and lower the safety bar. Once you reach the top, raise the bar, hold your tube up high so that you do not trip and quickly move to the exit. The minimum height required to use the chairlift is 1.32 metres.
- In the mechanical lift (telerafting), board the ride only at the bottom of the lift. Remain seated and keep your arms inside the ride. Disembark once the attendant at the top of the lift has unhooked your ride. Pull your ride to the designated place for departure.
- On the Bobsleigh/Vortex360 Magic Carpet, always remain standing in front of or behind your ride, as instructed by the attendant. Once at the top of the lift, pull your ride to the designated spot for departure.

# 2. RESPECT THE SECURITY BARRIERS AND THE MAXIMUM NUMBERS!

- Wait for an attendant to open the barrier. Never pass under it. Make sure the trail is clear before starting your descent.
- Respect the maximum number of sliders indicated on each trail before sliding.

#### 3. SLIDE SAFELY!

- Choose the appropriate trail level for you (beginner, intermediate, expert).
- Remain seated in the tube until the end of the trail.
- Keep your arms and legs close to you.
- Slide one behind the other in a line.
- Place yourselves from heaviest to lightest.
- Place yourselves facing the 'Partez ici' sign or on the side with the barrier.
- The sectors Avalanche and Formule 1 at the very top of the mountain is reserved for those who are a minimum height of 1.32 metres.

## **4. EXIT THE TRAILS QUICKLY!**

• When you finish your descent, exit the trail quickly and walk to the end. It is prohibited to cross trails.

### **5. RESPECT THE SIGNS!**

• Le Domaine has put signs in place that allows sliders to practice safe sliding. It is important to be aware of and comply with them. In addition, you should only slide in permitted areas.

# 6. RAFTING AND TORNADE

- Once at the top, gently lean the boat on the safety barrier before sitting down.
- To use to Tornade, you must be strapped in and remain attached with the seat belt during the entire descent.
- Remain seated during the entire ascent and descent, while keeping your arms inside the ride.
- Once at the bottom, help each other pull the ride to the bottom of the mechanical lift (telerafting).

#### 7. BOBSLEIGH DES NEIGES AND VORTEX360

- Minimum height required is 1.32 metres.
- Follow the instructions given by the attendant for a safe ascent.
- A helmet is mandatory and provided for the Bobsleigh sur Neige as well as the Vortex360.
- Be sure you are properly strapped in before descending.
- Remain seated and strapped in throughout the descent.
- Pull your ride until the bottom of the mechanical lift.

#### **TICKET RULES**

#### Be vigilant and respect the code. It is your responsibility!

- Tickets are issued in consideration of your commitment to respect the Code of Conduct on the mountains as well as all the regulations, instructions and rules of conduct in force at the winter sliding centre. If the code is violated, the ticket may be terminated and confiscated without notice or refund.
- This ticket remains the property of the winter sliding centre. It is personal, non-transferable and non-refundable.
- The customer acknowledges and accepts the risks inherent in winter sliding sports and assumes full responsibility for any material or bodily damage resulting from said risks or dangers.
- For a rewarding and safe experience, you must respect the Mountain Code of Conduct at all times and be courteous to others. You must follow all other rules and signs displayed or otherwise indicated by the sliding centre.
- The ticketholder and user of the chair lift (1) agrees that claims and legal recourse will be received in the province of Québec and (2) agrees that Québec laws will apply.
